

# Town of Arnprior Regular Meeting of Council: August 23, 2021

### Correspondence Package Number A-21-Aug-09

#### Recommendation:

**That** the Correspondence Package Number. A-21-Aug-09 be received, and that the recommendations outlined be brought forward for Council's consideration.

#### **Action Items:**

1. Resolution of Support – Chatham-Kent – Funding for Maintenance and Preservation Repair of Abandoned Cemeteries

Whereas Municipalities in Ontario have been made responsible for abandoned cemeteries within their boundaries, and are required by the Funeral, Burial and Cremation Services Act, 2002 "to ensure that the cemetery grounds, including all lots, structures, and markers, are maintained to ensure the safety of the public and to preserve the dignity of the cemetery; and

**Whereas** cemeteries are not only symbols of respect, preserving the memory of families, prominent citizens, and local history; some cemeteries are landmarks in themselves and hold great historical value worldwide; and

**Whereas** preservation repairs to older cemeteries are very costly, requiring the specialized services of stonemasons and archeologists; and

Whereas the care and maintenance funds of abandoned cemeteries are generally non-existent or so small as to produce insufficient annual interest to cover even the cost of lawn care at the site.

Therefore Be It Resolved That Council of the Corporation of the Town of Arnprior hereby urges the Government of Ontario to immediately provide funding sources for municipalities for the ongoing maintenance and preservation repair of abandoned cemeteries in their care; and

**Further That** this resolution be forwarded to the Bereavement Authority of Ontario (BAO), the Minister of Government and Consumer Affairs, the Rural Ontario Municipal Association (ROMA), the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO), local MPP, John Yakabuski, and the Municipality of Chatham-Kent.

#### 2. Request for Development Charges Funding – Arnprior Public Library

**That** Council of the Corporation of the Town of Arnprior receive the request from the Arnprior Public Library, dated July 29, 2021; and

**That** Council approve providing \$3,500.00 of Development Charge funding to the Arnprior Public Library, to pay for the purchase and installation of additional shelving units.

#### Resolution of Support – Fort Erie – Capital Gains Tax on Primary Residence

Whereas primary residences are currently exempt from a capital gains tax, and

**Whereas** currently secondary and additional non—primary properties are subject to capital gains, and

Whereas the Federal Government is currently looking into a primary residence capital gains tax as they have recognized that affordable housing has become a serious issue in Canada; and

Whereas smaller communities including the Town of Arnprior are seeing unprecedented higher selling prices that are outpacing prices in larger cities, and

Whereas many hard—working Canadians who have only a primary residence with no additional non—primary homes count on their home equity as financial aid to apply to upsizing or downsizing their home depending on their personal situation, and

Whereas a change in taxation to primary residences would be a significant financial blow to Canadians and would create an unfair, two-tiered taxation, which could lead to depleted savings, inter—generational disparities, disparities among diverse groups, such as seniors, who may have a significant portion of their savings vested in their primary residence, as well as, reducing the ability of home ownership, thereby a further, higher need for rentals; and

**Whereas** the Federal government could look at other means to slow down the rapidly escalating housing costs to improve housing affordability.

**Therefore Be It Resolved That** the Council of the Town of Arnprior request the Federal Government cease further consideration of eliminating capital gains tax exemptions on primary residences; and

**Further That** a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Right Honorable Justin Trudeau, Prime Minister, The Honorable Doug Ford, Premier of Ontario, MP, Cheryl Gallant, MPP John Yakabuski, and the municipality of Fort Erie.

4. Resolution of Support – Town of Cobourg – Bill C-6 an Act to Amend the Criminal Code (Conversion Therapy)

Whereas Bill C-6 an Act to amend the Criminal Code of Canada (Conversion Therapy) would prohibit certain activities that relate to "conversion therapy", which is defined as practices, treatment or services designed to change an individual's sexual orientation to heterosexual or gender identity to cisgender or to reduce non-heterosexual sexual attraction or sexual behavior; and Whereas Bill C-6 would enact new offences to prohibit:

- Causing an individual to undergo conversion therapy against their will;
- Causing a child to undergo conversion therapy;
- Removing a child from Canada to undergo conversion therapy abroad;
- Receiving a financial or other material benefit from the provision of conversion therapy; and
- Advertising an offer to provide conversion therapy; and

**Whereas** Bill C-6 would also authorize courts to order the seizure and forfeiture of advertisements for conversion therapy or order their removal from computer systems; and

**Whereas** overall Bill C-6 would promote the human dignity and equality of all Canadians, including those members of the LGBTQ2 community; and

**Whereas** Bill C-6 would discourage and denounce practices and treatments that cause psychological harm to LGBTQ2 people.

**Therefore Be It Resolved That** Council of the Corporation of the Town of Arnprior supports Bill C-6 an Act to amend the Criminal Code, regarding Conversion Therapy; and

**Further That** this resolution be forwarded to the County of Renfrew, MP, Cheryl Gallant, MPP John Yakabuski, and the Town of Cobourg.

 Request for Municipal Grant – In Kind Support – Arnprior Family Preschool Resource Centre (AFPRC) – EarlyON Arnprior – Waiving of fees for Robert Simpson Park Gazebo Rental

**That** Council of the Corporation of the Town of Arnprior receive the Municipal Grant Policy Application from the Arnprior Family Preschool Resource Centre (AFPRC) – EarlyON Arnprior; and

**Whereas** the Arnprior Family Preschool Resource Centre (AFPRC) – EarlyON Arnprior is an eligible community organization under the Municipal Grants Policy.

**Therefore Be It Resolved That** Council supports the Arnprior Family Preschool Resource Centre (AFPRC) – EarlyON Arnprior, by providing in-kind support of waiving the Robert Simpson Park Gazebo rental (value of approximately \$93.50), for the date of Thursday, September 23, 2021 from 5:00 pm – 8:00 pm; and

**Further That** the Arnprior Family Preschool Resource Centre (AFPRC) – EarlyON Arnprior be advised that it is mandatory to carry sufficient liability insurance and have the Town of Arnprior added as an additional insured for the event; and

**Further That** the Arnprior Family Preschool Resource Centre (AFPRC) – EarlyON Arnprior be advised that it is mandatory to follow all COVID-19 public health guidelines, including but not limited to social distancing and masking where distancing is not possible.
