I would like to begin by acknowledging that the land on which we work and gather is the traditional unceded territory of the Anishinaabe People. This Algonquin Nation have lived on this land for thousands of years, long before the arrival of the European settlers, and we are grateful to have the opportunity to be present in this territory.

On question of Committee Member Ananda Nicholas, the Clerk advised she had spoken to the GM, Operations and that the preference was for a bench already at the Town Hall (corner of Elgin and Madawaska) to be utilized and/or a bench in Robert Simpson Park. Committee Member Ananda Nicholas noted Milliken's offered to tree(s) near an existing bench near the playground that could be utilized as well.

10. New Business

a) Freedom Convoy

Ananda Nicholas noted frustration with the lack of communication from the Town on the arrival of the Freedom Convoy to Arnprior, as well as the use of municipal dollars to allow the Freedom convoy a place to park prior to their moving on to the City of Ottawa. The CAO thanked the member for her candid comments and apologized for the lack of communication however, made it clear that the municipality did not authorize, or utilize any municipal funds in any respect to the convoy. The CAO explained it was very clear that the convoy would be stopping at the truck stop in Arnprior, and the municipality, as well as the OPP, wanted to ensure that the impact on our town and residents was minimal, therefore the Airport Commission allowed the use of land for vehicular parking. The CAO further noted when it was clear the convoy intended to come back and use the land, it was made very clear that they were not welcome either in the municipality or at the airport.

The CAO did note that this evening staff were informed that some members of the convoy had entered the federally owned lands off Bev Shaw Parkway. Staff was directed to block the road from further traffic and the OPP were on scene and would be charging those persons with trespassing.

Committee Member Ananda Nicholas thanked the CAO for the explanation as this was a perfect example of messaging that residents needed to hear. The CAO proceeded to explain the municipality is in the midst of completing a communication strategy and is always looking for feedback on better ways to communicate with all of our residents. Committee Member Ro Nwosu noted radio advertisement, community boards, similar to the board at entrance to the trail off Madawaska Bridge, could showcase upcoming events, as well as advertising on community boards in the Mall and at Giant Tiger.










