The Community Poverty Action Network was founded in 1989, and is involved in a number of activities related to the elimination of child poverty and minimizing the effect that poverty has on children in need who live in Renfrew County. These activities fall under three categories practical assistance; advocacy; and education. The Arnprior Regional Health Foundation was founded in 2005 with a commitment to raise funds Please explain how this service, program or event benefits the Town of Arnprior and its residents.

The annual It shouldn't hurt to be a child hockey tournament, and events like it , help raise the profile of the town . The event not only brings out its own residents to participate in the hockey and the social events surrounding the hockey, but it attracts many visitors to the town in mid November that would not otherwise frequent the town .
