a) Home Fire and Life Safety Program Resolution Number 292-23 Moved by Billy Denault Seconded by Chris Toner

**That** Council receive Staff Report 23-09-11-01, entitled "Home Fire and Life Safety Program, Proactive Outreach Model" as information.

# Proclamation for Test Your Smoke Alarm Day (September 28<sup>th</sup>, 2023) Resolution Number 294-23

Moved By Tom Burnette Seconded By Dan Lynch

**That** Council proclaim September 28th, 2023 as "Test Your Smoke Alarm Day" in the Town of Arnprior.

**Whereas** "Test Your Smoke Alarm Day" marks the first day of action to promote installing and testing working smoke alarms in every home in Ontario;

**Whereas** in 2022, there were 133 fire fatalities in the Province of Ontario, the largest number of fire-related deaths in 20 years;

**Whereas** a working smoke alarm has been legally required to be installed on every storey of a residence in Ontario since 2006;

**Whereas** this new initiative and awareness campaign is led by the Ontario Fire Marshall and supported by the Arnprior Fire Department;

**Therefore**, the Council of the Town of Arnprior does hereby proclaim September 28th, 2023 as "Test Your Smoke Alarm Day" in the Town of Arnprior and urge all local residents to test the smoke alarms in their residence by pressing the test button, replacing the batteries and making sure that they are in good working order.

#### c) Proclamation for Fire Prevention Week (October 8<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup>, 2023) Resolution Number 295-23 Moved by Tom Burnette Seconded by Chris Couper

**That** Council proclaim October 8th to 14th, 2023 as Fire Prevention Week in the Town of Arnprior

**Whereas** the Town of Arnprior is committed to ensuring the safety and security of all those living in and visiting Arnprior; and

**Whereas** fire is a serious public safety concern both locally and nationally, and homes are the locations where people are at greatest risk from fire; and

**Whereas** residents should identify places in their home where fires can start and eliminate those hazards; and

**Whereas** residents should install working smoke alarms in every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home; and

**Whereas** residents should listen for the sound of the smoke alarm and when it sounds respond by going outside immediately to the designated meeting place; and

**Whereas** residents who have planned and practiced a home fire escape plan are more prepared and will therefore be more likely to survive a fire; and

**Whereas** our first responders are dedicated to reducing the occurrence of home fires and home fire injuries through prevention and protection education; and

**Whereas** the 2023 Fire Prevention Week theme, "Cooking safety starts with YOU. Pay attention to fire prevention", works to educate everyone about simple but important actions they can take to keep themselves and those around them safe when cooking;

**Therefore,** the Council of the Town of Arnprior, does hereby proclaim October 8th to 14th, 2023 as Fire Prevention Week in the Town of Arnprior and urge all residents and visitors to be aware of their surroundings, engage in fire safe practices and support the many public safety activities of the Arnprior Fire Department during Fire Prevention Week and all year long.

County Councillor Lynch noted the following items:

- Page 26 The Ontario government is expanding its successful skilled trades career fairs to even more cities with more exhibitors and twice as many participating students. If you are interested in attending a Career Fair one will be held on November 28, 29 at the EY Centre, 4899 Uplands Drive Ottawa, Ontario. Registration deadline is October 23, 2023.
- Page 46 Municipal Information & Data Analysis System (MIDAS). MIDAS is a webbased tool that provides access to the Financial Information Returns (FIRs) to all Ontario municipalities. Ontario municipal elected officials and staff can contact MIDASAdmin@amo.on.ca for access. In response to County Councillor Lynch, the General Manager of Client Services/Treasurer confirmed we already have access to the MIDAS system as we utilize it for submitting our annual Financial Information Returns.
- Page 46 The Ontario government is providing one-time grants of up to \$10,000 to ensure community spaces remain safe and secure from hate-motivated incidents. Applications are open for 2023-2024 and the deadline is September 12, 2023. In response to County Councillor Lynch, the CAO indicated that municipalities are not eligible to apply for this grant. County Councillor Lynch asked staff to communicate information pertaining to these grants with eligible community groups.
- Page 46 AMO and MISA ON's joint Municipal Cybersecurity 101 Forum returns this fall in time for Cybersecurity Month. This forum will be held virtually on October 12 from 10am to 2pm. In response to County Councillor Lynch, the CAO confirmed that staff will be attending.

Councillor Billy Denault noted the following items:

- Page 15 Ontario is investing an additional \$160 million to train workers. If you are looking for a career change, the Ontario government is investing in the Skills Development Fund after a labour shortage and this will help 100,000 workers get free training to meet the needs of employers hiring in their communities.
- Page 32 Ontario is driving economic growth in rural communities. The Ontario government is investing over \$4.3 million in up to 80 projects across the province through the latest intake of the Rural Economic Development (RED) Program. The RED program supports projects that diversify rural economies, retain skilled workers, and create jobs in local communities.
