



I am writing to formally request permission to host a 8th Annual walk in the town of Arnprior with all proceeds raised to support the purchase of life-saving equipment in our community and the Arnprior Regional Health Foundation.


As you may be aware, this event is held annually in the name of Penny Stashick, a valued member of the Arnprior community who passed away in November of 2017. Her selflessness, devotion to family, and goofiness are all traits that we have seen displayed at the "Penny's Ugly Sweater Walk" in years past. We feel like this event will help participants, and the community in general, unite during these difficult times.

Our team has been working closely with Derek Stashick (Penny's son) to plan this year's event, as it has become a holiday tradition for many Arnprior families. The event will consist of a registration period, a 2.5 km walk as well as a family-oriented event following the fun walk that has consisted of live holiday music, appearances by Santa Claus, and other small family activities.

Of course, due to COVID – 19 restrictions, we are planning pre-emptively to ensure that health and safety measures are followed distancing and proper hand hygiene are encouraged for everyone involved. As a Healthcare Foundation, we hold the health of our community paramount above all else. As in years past, we anticipate that we will be able to host this fun walk without the need of street closures or police presence, as we understand there is a cost associated with those measures. However, we have a great relationship with the Arnprior Fire Department and they have been open to guide participants, should that be needed. The proposed route for participants will be under the periodic supervision of volunteers, and all traffic laws will be adhered to during the event (i.e. waiting for cross walks etc.). The proposed route of the event is as follows:

2.5 km Walk -Walk through Downtown and Back

- Start at Robert Simpson Park;
- South along John Street;
- Walk through downtown;
- Turn around at McGonigal Street;
- North, back towards the Park to Finish.
- Will have to cross Madawaska Street and Elgin Street (there and back).







With this said, we would love to request permission for our event to take place Saturday December 6, 2025 from approximately 8:00am – 12:00pm at Robert Simpson Park. For the purposes of our event, we will be hanging various festive decorations, setting up tables for registration/hot chocolate/activities as well as using the Gazebo for live music/announcing prize winners etc.

As this event benefits the Amprior Regional Health Foundation, we have submitted a Grant Application to request that fees for park rental be waived so we are able to maximize the amount of charitable donations generated by the event.

We will host preliminary talks with the Parks Department (Graeme Ivory), Renfrew County Paramedic Services, and Arnprior Fire Department regarding the event, and look forward to hearing the Town's input prior to finalizing any details.

The "It Shouldn't Hurt to Be a Child" Hockey Tournament has been an Arnprior tradition since 1985, held annually at the Nick Smith Centre. For nearly four decades, our mandate has been to combine sport, community, and charitable fundraising.

Over the years, the tournament has raised funds for Victims of Violence, the Canadian Centre for Missing Children, the Make-A-Wish Foundation (Eastern Ontario), local families facing illness, and the Arnprior Regional Health Foundation.

In 2025, we are proud to once again support KidSport Renfrew County, helping ensure no child is left on the sidelines due to financial barriers. Our ongoing objective is to bring the community together in sport and fellowship while supporting meaningful causes that benefit children and families.

Please provide an overview of the service, program or event being supported with this funding.

The "It Shouldn't Hurt to Be a Child" Adult Hockey Tournament is a two-day event featuring mens and womens teams from across Eastern Ontario, Western Quebec, and the Ottawa Valley. In 2025, we anticipate over 30 teams and more than 350 players, ranging in age from 20 to 60+. With spectators, volunteers, and family members, the event draws approximately 400+ visitors to Arnprior each year.

The tournament includes:

- * Two full days of hockey at the Nick Smith Centre
- * Silent auction, prize draws, and fundraising activities for KidSport
- * Opportunities for community gathering and entertainment

Proceeds from the 2025 event will benefit KidSport Renfrew County, directly supporting children and youth who face financial barriers to participation in organized sports.

Town staff /Arena staff have always been supportive, however not directly supporting our initiatives.

If this submission/request differs from previous year(s), please describe the difference?

Yes, this year's request differs due to newly introduced municipal fees for extra facility insurance (KidSport has provided insurance however it does not cover alcohol), mandatory security, with hall rental. While we understand these reflect updated municipal policies, they create significant challenges for our ability to raise funds for KidSport, especially as our team entry fees have already been set to remain affordable for participants traveling from outside Arnprior.

Accordingly, our 2025 request includes specific consideration for the waiver of these new charges. This support will allow the event to remain financially viable, maximize charitable contributions, and continue delivering strong social and economic benefits for the Town of Arnprior.
